Interviewee: Latisha

Hello Latisha, how are you today?

I'm doing okay. Just a little tired.

We are here to interview you as a club member for the K-Language club. To start off, could you please introduce yourself?

Would you say the higher level assignments are suitable for your level?

Yes, I believe they're suitable for our level.

What are your expectations from this club?

Lastly, would you recommend server members join the club? If so, why?

Definitely, yes. The club is very friendly and very helpful and personally, it is a good club for lower levels since they can learn a lot here. Moreover, it's amusing to make fun of Griz sometimes.
