Interviewee: Lili Capacity: Club Member

Hello Lili, how are you today?

I'm good, thanks!

Okay, that's great! We are here today to interview as a member of the Song Analysis club. To start off, could you please introduce yourself?

Hello! I'm Lili, a member of Song Analysis Club.

Okay, well, hi Lili. So, how long have you been in this club?

Okay, that's a couple of good months. What has kept your coming back to song analysis club meetings and remaining in the club each month?

I love SAC (Song Analysis Club). For me, it's a great boost to my language learning journey.

That's great. So, how has the environment been in the club and its meetings?

Within SAC, it's really cool to discuss and hear everyone's thoughts during the sessions. Everyone's really encouraging and open to sharing, and I gain new insights after each session.

Oh, that's great then. So I noticed you are only in two clubs. Why did you choose this club, when there are so many others to choose from?



I'm ARMY, and it was so lovely to find and join this club! The content's great, and you get to learn new vocab and grammar points too.

Oh, okay. Well, that's good to hear. So what would you say is your favorite thing about the club?

I look forward to the sessions - it's cool to have a community to talk about the songs together, and I also enjoy the materials that are put together relating to the song of the week (kudos to the club leadership team for their hard work!).

Well I'm sure the club leadership would like to hear this. Soo, what is a fun memory you have in this club?

I think it was during the 'JITB (Jack in the Box)' release - I was quite busy then, and I heard the song for the first time on SAC. After the session, I thought - 'OMG, I have to go listen to the entire album **now**.'

Did you guys end up doing the whole album during the same month?

We couldn't cover all the songs. There was also an option to write about other songs in the assignments if we wanted to.

I believe it was 'Arson' and 'Stop'.

So, for how long have you been on this server for?

I joined the server in November of 2021.

So, was Song Analysis your first club then?

Oh okay. Well, that's good to hear! I'm sure you have been through many songs with the club. Which is a song you had the most fun analyzing?

It's hard to pick a favorite! We are currently going over 'Indigo' now - and it's amazing*!

Okay [laughs]. So, which song would you recommend the rest of the server to analyze that you have already analyzed with the club?

We just did 'Still Life', and it was really cool. The concept behind the Music Video, the visuals, the contrast between the song topic and the tune, and of course the wordplay in the lyrics! The members also contributed their thoughts, and it was an enjoyable session. The club has put together quite a lot of references and interviews that give a lot more insight to the song.

Okay! So I hope that everyone who reads this interview goes and analyzes the song now! How is club leadership?

I think it's a well-organized club! They are also nice and encouraging, and also really good at facilitating the sessions. Also appreciate the time and effort that goes into putting together the materials, discussion points etc.

So, do you like the assignments they give you?

Yep! My favorite ones are those where we can pick a song, choose a favorite lyric, write down some observations and new vocab and grammar that we've learned.



Oh! Okay, that was actually gonna be the next question, which is your favorite one. But yeah, do you find them time consuming, or are they perfect for the club?

Well I enjoy doing them so time flies by. I don't really notice to be honest.

[laughs] Okay well, would you like to see Song Analysis Club analyze any other songs apart from BTS songs?

I'm ARMY so my answer is going to be biased. The answer is no.

[chuckles] Yeah okay, I feel ya. I'm an ARMY as well.. So, I'm guessing that you only listen to BTS then? Or do you listen to other artists as well? In K-Pop I mean.

I am a more casual listener I guess? But primarily BTS.

So, do you have any ideas on how or where the club can improve?

I think the club has evolved since I joined - e.g. I thought having the slides and vocab reference was really handy as we talked about the songs.
